Implementation of LIFE in Italy: an overview

- Since 1992, a total of **828 projects** have been co-financed in Italy by the LIFE programme (including **2 integrated projects**): **18% of the EU total**.
- These projects represent a **total investment of € 1.2 billion (EU contribution: € 620 million)**.



Italy and Spain are the main beneficiaries of LIFE programme!





LIFE projects 2007- 2016: regional distribution (number)




LIFE projects 2007-2013:

action sector (%)



The Italian LIFE NCP carries out several actions in order to:

- ❑ Increase the number of applicants from Italy by offering them assistance in drafting proposals, in such a way that they could improve the proposals' quality and avoid the most common mistakes;
- ❑ Improve the knowledge of methods for participation in the annual *Call for Proposals* by using the website of the Italian Ministry of the Environment, Land and Sea and organising “*Info Days*” (*next: 8th May - Rome*) and “*Writing Workshops*”;
- ❑ Improve the knowledge of ongoing projects in Italy;
- ❑ Underline the complementarity between the LIFE Programme on one hand, and the European Structural and Investment Funds (ESI Funds) and other EU financial instruments linked to environmental and climate objectives (in particular Horizon 2020) on the other hand;
- ❑ Promote the replication and/or transfer of projects' results through concrete actions such as the realisation of the so called “Knowledge Platform”.

THE IDEA ORIGINATED FROM A NEED

The EU has funded or co-funded in Italy many significant projects through a range of programmes or initiatives, including LIFE, and these have demonstrated a wide variety of innovative environmental and climate-related techniques, methods, models and approaches. The projects have moreover contributed to the knowledge base for implementing EU legislation as well as informing policy-making.

The Italian Ministry of Environment, Land and Sea therefore decided to produce a “Knowledge Platform” (designed by the Italian LIFE NCP), which serves as a valuable and innovative tool for collecting and sharing best practices for environmental protection and climate action implemented in Italy with the support of EU funds.

The *“Knowledge Platform - Best practices for the Environment and Climate Action”* is a online resource (“dynamic website”) – connected to the web-portal of the Italian Ministry of Environment, Land and Sea – collecting best practices developed within the framework of projects funded or co-funded in Italy, during the programming periods 2007-2013 and 2014-2020, under EU programmes and initiatives such as LIFE, CIP Eco Innovation, CIP IEE, FP7, Horizon 2020, Interreg Alpine Space.

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE?

The main purpose of the Knowledge Platform is to facilitate the replication and/or transfer of best practices for Environment and Climate Action, promoting proven solutions that can be easily implemented by public authorities or the productive system (particularly by SMEs) in order to improve the effectiveness of public funding.

The Platform aims to ensure that investments have the maximum environmental or climate impact and that initiatives are well coordinated.

The Platform also aims to encourage private-public partnerships and raise awareness of key issues across all sections of society (it will allow visitors to stay informed about the latest environmental and climate-related technologies and methodologies in key areas).



WHO ARE THE USERS?

The Platform is for all public and private entities that plan to invest in the environment or in the climate action using replicable methods, techniques, models and approaches that have already been successfully tested in Italy at the national, regional or local level.

The Platform was set up to provide opportunities for those who have developed best practices to network with potential “replicators”.



The “Knowledge Platform”

WHAT DOES IT CONTAIN?

The Platform currently includes 93 projects, grouped into 8 thematic areas: Nature and Biodiversity (19), Water (12), Urban environment (6), Energy (5), Soil (5), Resources efficiency (18), Waste (13) and Climate (15).

For each project a “project sheet” describes the results achieved and the main outputs and deliverables (guidelines, handbooks, software, etc.). The “project sheets” are useful working tools for stakeholders interested in replicating the best practices collected in the Platform.

Furthermore, the website features sections on: national and EU environmental and climate legislation; EU funding programmes and initiatives that provide grants for environmental and climate-related actions; LIFE and H2020 financial instruments.

GESTIRE - Sviluppo di una strategia per gestire la Rete Natura 2000 in Lombardia

DESCRIZIONE

Il progetto LIFE CESTIRE è nato dall'esigenza di sviluppare una strategia integrata per la gestione della Rete Natura 2000 in Lombardia, contribuendo, in linea con la Strategia Europea per la Biodiversità fino al 2020, al ripristino ed al mantenimento di uno stato di conservazione soddisfacente di siti, habitat e specie, come lombarda, particolarmente soggetta a forti pressioni di tipo antropogenico, ma caratterizzata anche da una grande ricchezza di paesaggi naturali e dalla presenza di diversi habitat e specie, molte delle quali di interesse comunitario. All'interno dei 242 siti Natura 2000 della Lombardia, distinti in 193 siti di Importanza Comunitaria (SIC) e 67 Zone di Protezione Speciale (ZPS), talvolta sovrapposti - sono state censite, infatti, 61 specie di interesse comunitario inserite nell'Allegato VI della Direttiva 92/43/CE.

della Direttiva "Habitat" 87 specie di uccelli inseriti nell'Allegato I della Direttiva "Uccelli", nonché 13 habitat "prioritari" (di cui all'Allegato II della Direttiva 92/43/CEE) riferiti alle regioni biogeografiche Alpine e Continentali. GESTIRE il progetto è un gruppo di 9 organizzazioni, 3 dei quali italiani, che il Programma LIFE ha finanziato per la prima volta nel 2011 per formularne i programmi di gestione e di ripristino della Rete Natura 2000 ed elaborarne un "Quadro delle Azioni Prioritarie" (PAF - Prioritairy Actions Program) a sostegno dell'azione pan-europea.

L'obiettivo generale del progetto è stato quello di contribuire ad arrestare la perdita di biodiversità ed il degrado dei servizi ecosistemici (SE) mediante il raggiungimento di tre obiettivi specifici:

1. creare un sistema allargato e partecipato per gestire la Rete Natura 2000 della Lombardia e provvedere al mantenimento e al ripristino di uno stato di conservazione ottimale di siti, specie e habitat;
 2. realizzare un piano strategico nel lungo termine per la gestione e il ripristino di siti, specie e habitat per portarli a uno stato di conservazione favorevole prendendo in considerazione tutte le potenziali fonti di finanziamento a livello regionale, nazionale ed europeo e stabilendo una lista di azioni per il periodo fino al 2010;
 3. susseguire il livello di attenzione e di impegno degli uffici di gestione della rete Natura 2000;
 4. susseguire gli obiettivi di attenzione e di impegno degli uffici di gestione della rete Natura 2000;

Il progetto è sproposito come volano per un nuovo approccio culturale e gestionale alla Natura 2000, che può servire da modello per molte regioni italiane e non solo) è il tratta di un progetto pilota che si pone per la prima volta come obiettivo quello di affrontare un alto livello di complessità, coniugando il bene non trattabile della conservazione di habitat e specie di interesse comunitario con la sfida posta dei tempi occupazionali ed economici. Infatti, oltre a svolgere un ruolo cruciale nella protezione della biodiversità in Europa, i siti Natura 2000 sono una vasta gamma di vantaggi per le persone e per la comunità territoriale. Il progetto è stato definito in maniera tale da assicurare la sopravvivenza delle Natura 2000, per ampliare a supporto dei siti some parte della Rete Ecologica Regionale (RER).

LE FASI DEL PROGETTO

La definizione di una strategia a lungo termine per la gestione e la conservazione di siti, habitat e specie presenti nella Natura Rete 2000 (in corso) ha preceduto l'elaborazione di un piano di azioni di carattere preventivo e di apprendimento ambientale e scientifico per le diverse aree di intervento. I diversi programmi di azioni sono diretti agli obiettivi principali dei progetti per la conservazione delle aree di intervento, con azioni di monitoraggio e sensibilizzazione della popolazione.

Alla realizzazione di tali attività hanno contribuito, oltre alla Direzione Generale "Clima", Ambiente e Sviluppo sostenibile della Regione Lombardia, diversi soggetti pubblici e privati con esperienze sui temi della biodiversità, tra i quali l'Ente Regionale per i Servizi all'Agricoltura e alle Foreste (ERSA) la Fondazione Lombardia per l'Ambiente (FLA), la Lega Italiana Protezione Uccelli (Lipu), il Centro Turistico Studentesco e Giovani (CTS), la Comunità Montana e Fondazione Cariplo (in qualità di cofinanziatore).

- La raccolta di tutti i documenti già esistenti per la gestione dei siti Natura 2000 in Lombardia e la loro analisi;
 - La creazione di un "Gruppo Natura 2000" - composto dai rappresentanti delle diverse DG regionali con competenze sui siti della Rete Natura 2000 (agricoltura, cultura, turismo, servizi, infrastrutture e mobilità, ecc.) e da esperti Natura 2000 - per garantire la coerenza della programmazione per la gestione della Rete Natura 2000 in Lombardia con le varie politiche regionali;
 - Lo sviluppo di "best practices" per la gestione dei siti e della biodiversità in siti in altre regioni europee;
 - L'analisi e la stima dell'impatto ecologico della Rete Natura 2000 lombarda, considerando anche l'aspetto dei "green job" legati a Natura 2000 e le proposte per incentivare;
 - Analisi delle misure regolamentari vigenti ed eventuali ipotesi di aggiornamento;
 - Una capillare consultazione delle entità stakeholders nel territorio lombardo, cui è stato richiesto di contribuire alla stesura della strategia integrata di gestione della Rete Natura 2000 in Lombardia;
 - Una campagna di informazione e comunicazione a livello regionale per far conoscere la Rete Natura 2000 della Lombardia e l'importanza che questa riveste per la conservazione della biodiversità;
 - La definizione di linee guida per la conservazione della biodiversità nella Rete Natura 2000 da parte dei cittadini e delle imprese;
 - La formulazione delle guida di gestione per i siti senza un Piano di Gestione (PDG) e delle misure necessarie alla interconnessione dei siti della Rete;
 - La stesura del Documento Programmatico per la gestione della Rete Natura 2000 in Lombardia;
 - La redazione del PAF della Regione Lombardia;

RISULTATI RAGGIUNTI

L'elaborazione del Rapporto sull'analisi di documenti per la gestione dei siti Natura 2000 Lombardi [analizzati 422 documenti relativi alla gestione di Natura 2000 a livello europeo, nazionale e regionale ed altri documenti di interesse trasversale, in particolare sui cambiamenti climatici] e la Raccolta di casi studi su misure e buone pratiche di gestione di habitat(s) e sì in altre regioni europee (a seguito di una ampia ricerca bibliografica), sono stati utilizzati per la generazione di diverse soluzioni di gestione (proposte per gli ambienti forestali, i prati e le acque) (v. tabella 1); LEREF-NAT/0003/NAT/0003 per gli ambienti agroforesta, il progetto Ecomerci, finanziato dal Programma ECT "Spazio Alpino", per gli ambienti forestali) hanno consentito di avere a disposizione utili strumenti per la stesura della strategia di gestione della Rete natura 2000 regionale, nonché esempi di soluzioni a problematiche ampiamente diffuse in Lombardia.

L'analisi dei costi per la gestione della Rete Natura 2000 nella Regione Lombardia nel periodo 2008-2010 (comprensivo di un'utima serie di costi necessari per il 2010-2020), uno studio sui finanziamenti utilizzati dalla Rete nel periodo 2007-2011 (finanziamenti comunitari, nazionali e regionali concessi per interventi e progetti con ricadute positive sulle aree Natura 2000 del valore complessivo di 608,46 M€) ed un piano finanziario per la gestione delle aree Natura 2000 per il periodo 2012-2020. Il piano finanziario è stato elaborato sulla base dei dati disponibili e dei ricerche proposte da una stima ipotetica degli interventi e delle uscite in relazione a tre diversi scenari: pessimistico, intermedio ed ottimistico) hanno permesso di conoscere le forze economiche ed umane in campo e le necessità futuri per una migliore implementazione del network Natura 2000. Il lavoro svolto per elaborare il piano finanziario è stato la base per la creazione di un sito web dedicato (www.finanziamenti-naturanatura2000.it) che permette in modo semplice ed intuitivo di individuare tutti i finanziamenti disponibili, nel periodo di programmazione 2014-2020, per interventi specifici nei siti Natura 2000. Il portale ha lo scopo di aumentare la capacità di tutti gli attori



WHAT COULD BE ITS ROLE ?

The Knowledge Platform **could contribute to:**

- raise awareness on the threat** of alien species and the need to support native species recovery actions;
- spread lesson learnt and best practices** on managing IAS and their pathways;
- promote networking activities** to increase opportunities for sustainability of the results of measures dealing with IAS;
- ensure appropriate information flow and replicability and transferability** of experiences of projects targeting IAS;
- increase synergies** between LIFE and other EU financial instruments which may facilitate the development of tools to efficiently manage IAS.

LIFE Multi Annual Work Programme (MAWP) 2018-2020

- Budget: € 1.657.063 million**
- nature conservation and environmental protection: € 1 243.81 million
- climate action: € 413.245 million

- Increase of nature and biodiversity budget by 10%**

- Reduced number of project topics (Environment sub-programme): down from 87 to 42**

- Traditional projects other than “Nature and Biodiversity”: co-funding rate 55%**

LIFE MAWP 2018-2020: 2-stage application

Rationale for introducing 2-stage application

- Simplification of the application process and evaluation of LIFE traditional projects
- Easier procedure & faster feedback
- Need to address the decreasing number of applications for LIFE co-financing in recent years

LIFE MAWP 2018-2020: 2-stage application

What is LIFE 2-stage application approach?

- New simplified 2-stage approach
 - 1**
Concept note
 - 2**
Full proposal
- Only for Environment sub-programme
- Only for traditional projects



LIFE MAWP 2018-2020: 2-stage application

Stage 1: Concept Note (Submission)

What should the Concept Note include:

- Basic information about the coordinating beneficiary
- Description of the environmental problem targeted (for environment and information & governance strands)/description of species, habitats, biodiversity issues targeted by the project (for nature and biodiversity strands)
- Project objectives
- The project partners (information on the coordinating and associated beneficiaries, and co-financers of the project)
- Description of the project actions and means involved

LIFE MAWP 2018-2020: 2-stage application

Stage 1: Concept Note (Submission)

What should the Concept Note include:

- Expected results and impacts of the project
- The sustainability of project results
- Projects topics
- Project risks and constraints
- The EU added value of the project (understood at this stage as the contribution to LIFE priorities and objectives)
- The pilot or demonstration character of the project (and/or best practice for nature and biodiversity strand)
- An indicative budget for the project

Max. 10 pages + high-level budget

LIFE MAWP 2018-2020: 2-stage application

Stage 1: Concept Note (Submission)

Concept Note should not include:

- Signed commitments
- Maps, pictures, attachments

LIFE MAWP 2018-2020: 2-stage application

Stage 1: Concept Note (Submission)

Concept note forms (on e-Proposal): will be seamlessly **part of the full proposal**, thus avoiding successful applicants have to complete them again (forms will be editable).

The structure of the concept notes could be the following :

Administrative forms (A forms):

- A1 – General project information**
- A2 – Coordinating beneficiary**

Stage 1: Concept Note (Submission)

Concept note forms (on e-Proposal)

Project outline forms (B forms):

- B1 – *Summary description of the project*** (with additional boxes covering sites, species/habitats/ecosystems, partnership, constraints and sustainability)
- B3 – *General character of the project & EU added value***

Financial application forms:

- R1 – *Project budget*** (to be completed by applicant with total estimated per line)

LIFE MAWP 2018-2020: 2-stage application

Stage 1: Concept Note (Evaluation)

Concept Note eligibility criteria

A project proposal is eligible if:

- contributes to one or several of the general objectives set out in Article 3 of the LIFE Regulation and of the applicable specific objectives in Articles 10, 11 and 12 of the LIFE Regulation
- falls within the scope of the priority area of the LIFE sub-programme for Environment under which the project proposal was submitted
- takes place in the Union and/or territories to which the Treaties and relevant acquis apply or it fulfils one of the exceptions laid down in Articles 5 and 6 of the LIFE Regulation and specified in the Guidelines for applicants 2018

LIFE MAWP 2018-2020: 2-stage application

Stage 1: Concept Note (Evaluation)

Concept Note eligibility criteria

A project proposal is eligible if:

- corresponds to one of the following project types:
 - Pilot projects
 - Demonstration projects
 - Best practice projects
 - Information, awareness and dissemination projects
- is not focused on research or dedicated to the construction of large infrastructure

Stage 1: Concept Note (Evaluation)

Concept Note Eligibility Criteria

In addition, there's a requirement of compliance with eligibility criteria specific to each priority area:

- priority area **Environment and Resource Efficiency** must contain actions that lead to substantial and measurable direct effects on the environmental and/or climate action issue(s) targeted
- priority area **Nature and Biodiversity**, must dedicate at least 25% of the eligible budget to concrete conservation actions
- priority area **Environmental Governance and Information** must contain actions that lead to substantial and measurable direct or indirect effects on the environmental issue(s) targeted by causing substantial and measurable direct effects on the environmental governance, information, and/or awareness and dissemination issue(s) targeted

Stage 1: Concept Note (Evaluation)

Concept Note Award Criteria

Overall quality of the proposal

- clarity of the intervention logic of the proposal (including the description of the pre-operational context),
- its feasibility,
- and indicative value for money.

Overall EU added value

- the project contribution to the LIFE priorities,
- its expected impact,
- and the sustainability of the project results.

Concept Note Award Criteria	Minimum pass score*	Maximum score
1. Overall quality of the proposal	5	20
2. Overall EU added value	10	30
Overall (pass) scores	15	50



LIFE MAWP 2018-2020: 2-stage application

Stage 1: Concept Note (evaluation and ranking)



Stage 2: Full proposal (invitation and submission)

The applicants with the best ranked concept notes will be invited to submit a full proposal (stage 2) using the web tool e-Proposal available via the LIFE page (same way for submitting a concept note)

If the application is admitted to stage 2 ...

- The applicant is allowed to introduce **changes to the total requested EU contribution within margin of 10%**
- There is no limit to other changes in the budget (including total project cost) as long as the total EU contribution does not increase by more than 10%

LIFE MAWP 2018-2020: 2-stage application

2-stage submission process - Advantages for applicants:


- The submission of a concept note that is approximately 10 pages long requires less time and fewer resources than a full proposal (in case of the application is unsuccessful)
- Applicants will receive feedback sooner on whether their proposal has a chance to be financed (has been admitted to stage 2)
- Applicants invited to participate in stage 2 will have a higher chance of seeing their projects financed, as the competition will be open only to high ranking concept notes



Project topics implementing thematic priorities for biodiversity:

*Link with Nature Directive

1. Green infrastructure
2. Integration of biodiversity into financial and business decisions
3. Threatened species or habitats that are not included in the annexes of the Habitat Directive
4. **Invasive Alien Species (IAS)**



Invasive Alien Species (IAS)

4. Addressing **Invasive Alien Species** (⁷) by testing and implementing the following three steps on an appropriate spatial scale within a comprehensive framework:

- preventing the introduction of invasive alien species, in particular by tackling the priority pathways of their introduction,
- establishing an early detection and rapid eradication system, and
- eradicating, controlling or containing established invasive alien species.

The projects should be set up to improve existing — or introduce new — technical, administrative and/or legal frameworks on the relevant level, in particular in relation to, but not limited to, the species included on the list of invasive alien species of Union concern pursuant to Article 4(1) of the Regulation (EU) No 1143/2014 of the European Parliament and of the Council (⁸).

Explanatory note: Where a step has already been addressed independently of the project or it is not possible to address it in the project context, the project actions shall at least be clearly situated in a broader framework that links all three steps.



Invasive Alien Species (IAS):

- Introduced, through human action, intentionally or unintentionally, across ecological barriers outside their natural range, with negative impacts on biodiversity and related ecosystem services
- IAS one of major causes of biodiversity loss
- Impact and costs constantly rising
- LIFE: key tool supporting action against IAS**

The «three steps» for the prevention and management of the introduction and spread of IAS



Regulation 1143/2014 on IAS entered into force on 1/1/2015

- **Chapter 1: General provisions**
- Chapter 2: Prevention
- Chapter 3: Early Detection and Rapid Eradication
- Chapter 4: Management of widely spread IAS
- Chapter 5: Horizontal provisions
- Chapter 6: Final provisions

LIFE MAWP 2018-2020: Project topics IAS

Examples on actions on IAS (1)

Prevention:

- Unintentional introduction, e.g. ballast water, cleaning equipment, preventing spread through soil transport, man-made corridors ...
- Intentional introduction, e.g. involve relevant sectors and actors: horticulture, pets, aquaria,..., customs, consumers...
- Promotion of native species as alternatives to IAS...

LIFE MAWP 2018-2020: Project topics IAS

Examples on actions on IAS (2)

Early detection – rapid eradication:

- Early warning systems, e.g. involving relevant groups: anglers, hunters, landowners, foresters, horticulturists, farmers, etc.
- Ensure rapid reaction: avoid establishment of new populations

Examples on actions on IAS (3)

Eradication, control or containment:

- Lethal or non-lethal methods for eradicating vertebrate species, selective trapping, take back systems, minimal side-effects, alternatives to pesticides, ...
- Combine eradication/management with restoration, rebuilding resilience towards new invasions


Examples on actions on IAS (4)

Horizontal issues:


- Awareness raising – explain the IAS problematic
- Involve stakeholders and the wider public
- Address concerns (animal welfare, use of pesticides...)
- Citizen science/smartphone applications

Country level




10 x 10 Km Grid
