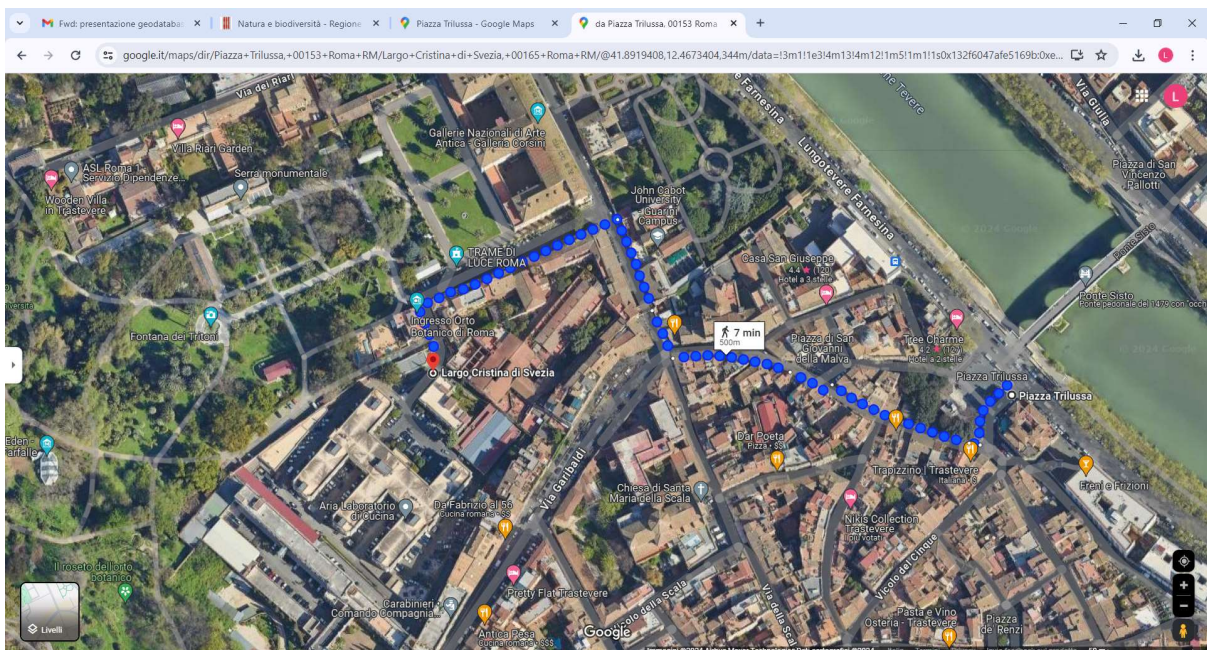

## TRANSPORT

### From Leonardo da Vinci-Fiumicino Airport

Fiumicino airport is approximately 40/50 minutes from **Rome city centre**.

### To get to Rome city centre:

- **Leonardo Express Train to Termini Station (the Main Train and Underground Station) in the city centre** – take the train inside the airport, the *LE* leaves and arrives at Terminal 3 (international departures) from 05.38 am until 11.53 pm, 7 days a week, the service leaves every 15 minutes in both directions without intermediate stops. At Roma Termini the service will run to Fiumicino airport from 04.50 am until 11.05 pm (at platforms 23 and 24).  
**The single ticket costs 14 Euro.** See the official link for connections between Roma – Fiumicino airport: <http://www.trenitalia.com/tcom-en/Services/Fiumicino-Airport>
- **Taxi** (all destinations) – taxi stands available outside the arrivals of each Terminal, one ride to the city costs around from 30 to 50 Euro. Here are a few numbers you can call for taxis (06 is the area code for Rome and must be dialled before the local taxi number as shown below):  
Radio Taxi 4157: Dial 06-4157, Radio Taxi 3570: Dial 06-3570, Pronto Taxi 6645: Dial 06-6645, other Taxi companies: 06-5551, 06-4994, 06-4157.
- **FL1 local train** – take the local train inside the airport. This service has stops south and east of Rome from which you can connect with the metro, tram, or city bus to reach any part of the city.  
**The stops of the FL1 train are Trastevere, Ostiense or Tuscolana. To get to the Termini station, you'll need to get off the train at Ostiense, and then ride the connection to Piramide Station on the B metro line (direction Rebibbia). From there you can reach Termini in 7 minutes.**  
**The FL1 train price of a one-way ticket to any of the four stations mentioned above is € 8.00 (round trip € 16.00).**  
Tickets can be purchased at the automatic machines (or on Trenitalia's website <https://www.trenitalia.com/en.html>)  
**The price to take the Metro or a Bus is € 1.50.**  
**How to get venue location (Via Quattro Novembre 149)**
  - **From Roma Termini Railway station Bus n°40, 64,70, 170, H (bus stop near to Quirinale)**
